#### **Student Council Report:**

- Athletic Executive: Meagan Brown (President) reported many sports are completing their season (boy's volleyball, tennis, golf, girls basketball). The cross-country team won the regional championships and were heading to City Championships. Sports starting for the winter season are swimming, hockey, girl's volleyball, badminton, cricket and boys basketball. Intramural flag football has been held at lunch hours...it includes student teams and a teacher team. Friday Night Lights was very successful and the Senior ECI Rams won the game in the last few minutes of play. The buyout for the basketball tournament was held recently. There will be fundraising this year with bake sales and barbecues to raise money for the new format for the athletic banquet at the end of the year.

# Principal & Vice-Principal Reports: Gordy Stefulic, Sam Iskandar & Jinah Park

#### Gordy Stefulic

- The October 16<sup>th</sup> incident was discussed regarding the early dismissal, the process and the letter sent home. The students and staff left the school at lunch with the exception of some students under the age of 16 whereby the school needed to call parents before releasing these students. These students evacuated to Central Arena on Montgomery Rd. with the administration. There were some challenges in reaching some parents based on current contact information in the system. It is very important that the school be notified of any changes to your child's personal information especially new phone numbers and addresses.
- The "Empowering Student Partnership Program" has begun with 30 students and teacher-advisor Barbara Wagner-Heim. It involves working with the police on a perception survey on how safe the students feel at school.
- Take our Kids to Work will be held November 7 for Grade 9 students. Forms must be completed and submitted to participate otherwise classes as usual.

#### **New Business**

- A parent inquired about any bacterial infections at ECI considering the recent news form the US about a student. Gordy Stefulic indicated there have been no issues identified in the school.
- There was an inquiry about Special Ed. Students and IEP (Independent Education Plans). All teachers are informed of any special education needs of students. Parents with questions can contact the Guidance Department to discuss.
- Punctuality can be problem for some students at the school. Administration is working with the grade nines on attending class on time.
- Street crime officers in plain clothes come to the school to talk to the students. In January, the street crime officers will be in full uniform which may not allow for the same relationship connection to the students. There are no undercover police within the school – this would mean they are posing as students and that is not in place.
